 - 7.5 Legislative update- The Executive Directors from the six Regional Education Service Centers met with Shuana Tucker & Christopher Todd, CT State Dept of Education Talent Office, to open lines of communication and the RESC will be hosting forums for educators as an initial step on revising teacher evaluations system (TEVAL). Mrs. Ericson is sitting on the state-wide Educator Evaluator & Support Council to draft a proposal for legislation for 2022 or 2023.

 RESC Executive Directors also met with John Scianimanico, Office of the Governor, an advocate for a stable magnet funding formula. He also espoused the benefits of the CT Teacher Residency Program (TRP)
 - 7.6 LEARN Agency updates- Sept 27, 2021- began state mandated testing protocols for all unvaccinated staff- LEARN's numbers: 526/554 vaccinated (95%) and 28 not vaccinated (5%) LEARN developed a vaccination app to track vaccinations confidentially.

Leadership Team built strategies/practices to address the higher levels of resignations currently affecting many districts to retain staff, especially the school based non-certified support staff, by repurposing federal assistance funds and hosted two "Employment Fairs".

School staff training in suicide prevention; QPR (Question/Persuade/Refer) which offers practical strategies for everyday people to support someone who may be having suicidal thoughts. LEARN is partnering with Ann Daigle, of the local non-profit, Brian's Healing Hearts and the Center for Hope and Healing.

Lotteries for LEARN Magnet Schools closed on Oct. 1 and with the exception of the Regional Multicultural School (3 seats unfilled) all schools fulfilled the state enrollment capacity.
